# Safety instructons

#### TECHNOLOGICAL RISKS

(industrial, nuclear or the transport of dangerous goods)

In the event of a serious industrial or radiological accident, campground occupants would be alerted by the warning signal broadcast by the PPI (Plan Particulier d'Intervention) sirens on the sites at risk.

The alert can also be broadcast by cars equipped with loudspeakers (depending on the case, fire department, law enforcement or municipal vehicles).

The warning signal sounds for 3 times 1 minute, separated by a short silence (national warning code).

The end of the alert is announced by a siren, which emits a continuous tone for 30 seconds. This signal means that the danger has passed, and that compliance with safety instructions is no longer necessary.

Depending on the situation, the operator can broadcast the alert using the means at his disposal (PA system, megaphone, etc.).

- **Instructions** 1. Do not take refuge in caravans, tents or vehicles (they are not **to be** always airtight).
- followed as 2. Leave your vehicle and camping equipment on site.
- **soon as the** 3. Go to the assembly point (see evacuation plan).
- **alert** is 4. Do not try to reach your loved ones.
- issued: 5. Once you are sheltered: Fermez toutes les ouvertures vers l'extérieur (portes, fenêtres).
  - Turn off ventilation and air conditioning.
  - Keep away from doors and windows.
  - No smoking, flames or sparks.
  - Do not telephone.
  - Wash if irritated and, if possible, change clothes
  - Listen to the radio (battery-operated): France BLEU France Inter - Europe 2.
  - Don't leave the premises unless ordered to do so (follow the operator's instructions).

In the event of radioactive releases, the Prefect may order the absorption of stable iodine (tablets are available from the campsite operator). <u>Tablets may only be taken</u> on the instructions of the Préfet.

# Safety instructons

### FLOODING - COASTAL STORMS

All campers would be notified of the evacuation order by the campground operator. In such circumstances, **stay calm and follow the instructions to the letter**:

- 1. Turn off the gas to the outside and the electricity.
- 2. Get to the heights or regrouping area as quickly as possible.
- 3. Take only your identity papers, currency and most precious objects with you.
- 4. Leave your vehicle and camping equipment on site.
- 5. Do not take refuge in caravans (in the event of heavy flooding or coastal storms, caravans can be swept away).
- 6. Don't retrace your steps.

Consult the evacuation map of the site at reception and on the washbasins, toilets, etc... Find your escape route to the assembly area in advance. Evacuation routes are symbolized by the logo below:



# Safety instructons FOREST FIRES

If you see a fire starting, stay calm.

- 1. Close gas cylinders outdoors.
- 2. Immediately notify the campsite management, who will alert the fire department.
- 3. Never approach a fire zone on foot or by car.
- 4. Clear access and escape routes.
- 5. Move away in the opposite direction.

Consult the campsite's safety regulations at reception.
